SCHEDULE AND ENTRY FORM

The aim of the show is to encourage friendly competition, an interest in gardening and creativity, and to raise funds for the Grindleton Recreation Ground Charity.

Rules

- **Entries are invited from residents of Grindleton and from members of Grindleton based Groups, Societies etc.**
- The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry that is thought to be contrary to the aims and spirit of the show.
- **Entry forms to be in by 5pm Friday 25th August**, to Mandy Brennan - telephone 441551.
- Only one entry per person per class will be accepted.
- **Entries must be placed in the Pavilion between 9.00-11.00 a.m** on the day of the show. The room will be cleared at 11.00 and no unauthorised person will be allowed in the hall until after the judging.
- The decision of the judges will be final.
- No exhibits to be removed from the hall until after prize giving.
- **Items can be donated for sale after the show with the proceeds going towards Recreation Ground funds.**
- Exhibitors are required to provide their own containers.
- **Entrants aged under 16 should give their age on the entry form. Judges will take age into account.**
- Rules for each class to be strictly observed.
- All entries in classes 1-13 & 18-39 must **be grown by the exhibitor.**
- Although every care will be taken the organisers cannot be responsible for the loss or damage to exhibits.
- Prizes to be awarded: 50p, 30p, 15p for 1st; 2nd; and 3rd. place

Pots or vases not to exceed 10" in dia. (14" for Class15).
All pot plants should have been grown by the exhibitor or been in his/her possession for at least 6 months prior to the show,

- 3. Flowering Pot Plant - in Bloom
- 4. Vase of Sweet Peas, 6 stems
- 5. Vase of 3 Dahlias
- 6. A spike of Gladioli
- 7. Vase of Cosmos
- 8. Bloom or Spike of Blooms,
Single variety not named above
- 9. Three stems of perennial blooms
Single variety not named above
- 10. Vase of any mixed garden flowers
- 11. One Spike Multi-flowered Rose, any variety
- 12. One Specimen Rose with foliage on stem
- 13. 5 Nasturtium Flowers floating in a white dish

Floral Art Classes

- 14. Arrangement on theme "New Beginnings". (*Max 18"x18"*)
- 15. Arrangement in a container made from twigs / bark
